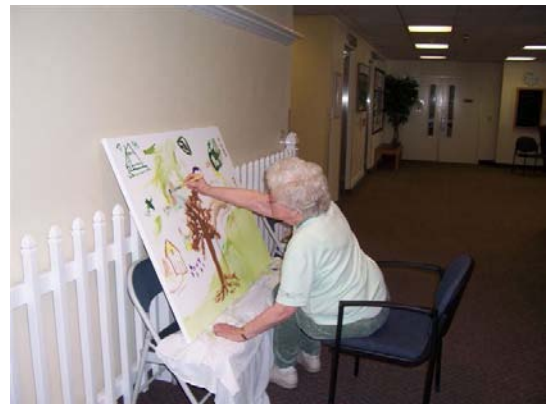
## Searching for Hobbyists

Here is an interesting story, which may or may not be true:

Many years ago in Duluth, Minnesota, a Jewish man was run over in the iron mines. He was taken to a Catholic hospital, where an Episcopal doctor removed his leg.
