Then Jesus told them this parable: "Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Does he not leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it?" (Luke 15:4 NIV)

Just Suppose

In your imagination, picture yourself as one of these 100 sheep. The shepherd with his trusty sheep dog has led you to a lush green meadow of tender grass but you taste something you like better than the grass. You wander off from the flock to find more of this tender plant.

Searching here and there, you don't realize that you are no longer in sight of the master and other sheep. As you fill your tummy full of this delicious plant, you get sleepy. You lie down, tucking your feet under your belly and fall fast asleep.

While you sleep, the good Shepard takes his flock back to the shelter. As he counts the sheep, he discovers one is missing. Leaving his trusty dog to guard the ninety and nine, he returns to the meadow, searching, calling, and praying.

Having had a good nap, you (remember you're the sheep) wake up to find it's now night, the flock is gone and strange night-noises frighten you. You cry out and the shepherd hears you. Soon you are swooped up in his loving arms, and he carries you back to the rest of the flock and to safety.

Our great Shepherd knows that some may stray from the fold, but he searches until he finds us. In Hebrews 13:5-6 we read: "He himself has said, I will never leave you nor forsake you. So we may boldly say, the Lord is my helper, I will not fear. What can man do to me?"

Happy Birthday “Happy Birthday to You”



It is estimated that the song “Happy Birthday to You” is sung somewhere in the world every minute of every day, but there was a time when this familiar song did not exist.

Mildred J. Hill, a schoolteacher from Kentucky, first composed the now-famous music on June 27, 1859. The lyrics originated as “Good Morning to All,” and were first published in the book *Song Stories for Sunday School*. Mildred’s sister, Patty Smith Hill, is responsible for adding a stanza with the lyrics “Happy Birthday to You” in 1924.

Sadly, Mildred Hill died on June 5, 1916, never hearing the words that would make her music famous, and never having someone sing “Happy Birthday to You” to her on her own birthday.
